

Thinking process = Seeing analogies (similar relationships, finding relating factors)


Thinking Map = Bridge Map

How does it work?

It shows the relating factor between objects, ideas etc – looking at the similarities in the relationships.

- 1. To the left is the relating factor that will link all the pairs of objects, ideas etc
- 2. The pairs are presented with one on the top of the bridge and one below
- 3. Each pair is followed by the inverted V link and the word "as" underneath. This indicates "in the same way as"
- 4. You should be able to make full sentences from the results

e.g. A finger is a part of a hand – in the same way as – a toe is a part of the foot – in the same way as – a spoke is a part of a bicycle wheel – in the same way as – a carriage is a part of a train.
